Begun in 1980, the Dancing Wheels Company and School is a unique organization that has pioneered the inclusion of people with and without disabilities through the arts. Founding Artistic Director Mary Verdi-Fletcher revolutionized the concept of physically integrated dance. Today, the company utilizes this art form to educate, advocate, and entertain audiences throughout the world. The Dancing Wheels Company has reached audiences of over four million people through school assembly programs, workshops, residencies, story ballets and main stage concert performances.

To fulfill the many requests for the specific and unique training experience that the Dancing Wheels Company offers, a multi-arts school for individuals with and without disabilities was established in 1990. Located in Cleveland, Ohio, the fully accessible studios have become a global center where dance enthusiasts, dancers, choreographers, educators and many interested individuals could come from around the world to train and work. The School of Dancing Wheels offers an array of classes and workshops in dance technique, translation, movement and theater for children and adults of all abilities.
