Doors will open at 7:30 p.m. and the lecture will begin at 8:00 pm. Immediately following, there will be a question and answer session, as well as a book signing. This event is free of charge.

Senior magazine journalist for Spin Magazine, Chuck Klosterman offers his clever commentary on the media present in today's society. He writes a monthly column, "Chuck Klosterman's for America" for Esquire and has written for The New York Times, GQ, and ESPN.

Klosterman's first book, *Fargo Rock City*, is about heavy metal, but according to former Talking Heads front man David Byrne, it is actually about "how media-saturated culture feels." His next book *Sex, Drugs and Cocoa Puffs: A Low Culture Manifesto*, has been called "one of the brightest pieces of pop analysis to appear in the country," by the Onion A.V. Club. In, *Killing Yourself to Live: 85% of a True Story*, Klosterman takes a road trip across America to visit the gravesites of dead rock stars. His next book, a collection of his journalism and columns, is tentatively titled *Chuck Klosterman 4*.
