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Student Entertainment Events Presents: Third Eye Blind

Student Entertainment Events and Pepsi are pleased to announce this semester's first major concert event featuring Third Eye Blind. On Friday, Nov. 9, the audience in Ritchie Coliseum will sing along to old favorites and hear some new tunes when the show begins at 7:30 p.m. Doors for the event will open at 7 p.m., and tickets are available at the Hoff Ticket Office in the Adele H. Stamp Student Union. Tickets are \$26.50 with a UMID and \$36.50 for the general public.

Third Eye Blind, a San Francisco based quartet, made their big break with their self-titled debut album in 1997. The album's first single "Semi Charmed Life" was matched in popularity with four more undeniably legendary songs, including "Graduate," "How's It Going To Be," "Losing a Whole Year," and "Jumper." Selling six million copies and remaining on the Billboard Top 200 Albums Chart for more than a year, this album causes college students to rehash high school and middle school days with a smile upon hearing it. Their following album, *Blue*, was released in 1999 and its hit single "Never Let You Go" carried the band on its back with ease as they accomplished a sold-out year long tour.

After a three-year hiatus because singer and guitarist Stephan Jenkins' mother was diagnosed with cancer, the band released *Out of the Vein* in 2003. Jenkins, along with bassist Arion Salazar, guitarist and vocalist Tony Fredianelli and drummer Brad Hargreaves, received consistently positive reviews on the album, which featured the singles "Blinded" and "Crystal Baller." Reviews, however, did not parallel the album's sales as the band's record company Elektra Records was imploding into Atlantic Records and did little promoting for the record.

This past summer, Third Eye Blind toured across the country serenading faithful audience members with new songs to be released on their upcoming album.
